

2026 FTTA Gospel Trips

Report and Prayer Burdens 8

January 22, 2026

EUROPE

Germany (Berlin)

January 21

We started the day with a joint Zoom call connecting teams from across Europe: including Germany, France, Italy, Luxembourg, Portugal, and Poland. The burden for this time was to impress the saints with the Lord's present move throughout Europe and to highlight the importance of gaining Europe for the Lord's second coming.

In the afternoon, a pair of sisters joined a local sister for a shepherding appointment, while the rest of the team participated in Bible distribution at Goethe University in Frankfurt. During the gospel outreach, we spoke with two girls who were very open to receiving Bibles and to having Bible studies with the local saints.

In the evening, we were divided into pairs and sent to various saints' homes for dinner and fellowship. One pair attended a college meeting dinner.

Prayer Burdens:

1. That the Lord would bless the seeds sown through our tabling and Bible distribution at Goethe University, and that two new contacts would be connected with the local Frankfurt saints and have regular Bible studies and shepherding appointments.
2. For the softening of the hearts of the students, particularly the science department.
3. That the Lord would open the way for a newly saved student in Frankfurt to participate in a short-term training with the Full-time Training in London in March.

Germany (Hamburg)

January 20

Frankfurt Hub teams arrived in Germany on Tuesday, January 20. In the evening, all the German teams joined the Frankfurt prayer meeting where we prayed for the cities of Düsseldorf, Hamburg, and Berlin, particularly for the enemy to be bound and for the people to be brought from darkness to light.

January 21

We started our day with a European orientation on the burden of Europe, then we had a Germany-specific fellowship of the history of the Lord's move in Germany. Later in the day we went to Goethe University in Frankfurt to distribute Bibles. Both the Berlin and Hamburg teams joined this time. We found that the students there were very open to speak to us about the Lord. We had many positive interactions and even a handful of contacts were passed along to the local saints.

January 22

After travelling to Hamburg, we had dinner with the saints along with a Hamburg-specific orientation. During the time we spoke about the burden to reach students and gain contacts to bring to the gospel dinner at the end of the gospel trip. We will begin our time on campus tomorrow, the 23rd.

Italy (Padua)

January 20

We split again into two groups, one going to the city center and the other tabling and speaking to students at the University of Padua. The sisters met again for lunch with a seeking contact from Lebanon, who enjoyed meeting the saints afterwards. Also, a Syrian girl who approached the table is coming to the Friday gospel dinner and wants to bring her Italian friend who has a desire to study the Bible. There were quite a number of positive contacts who exchanged contact information and were open to meeting again. Pray that they would be responsive to our further contact.

January 21

In the morning, a group of about fifteen saints went to the University of Padua to preach the gospel. Some saints went with one of the local students to eat lunch with her unbeliever gospel contacts, whom she met through school and had already come to a couple dinners in her family's home. In the evening, some of the saints visited the neighbors of the saints and had tea and dessert. Finally, the saints hosted four students who had already been saved for dinner in their home to speak a small word on baptism.

January 22

Three saints traveled to Trieste to visit and refresh the handful of saints there as well as meet with some of their gospel contacts. A large group went to the University of Padua, where we tabled and talked to students. A few saints had follow-up times with some contacts from earlier in the week, with some more confirmed to meet for one-on-one contacts on Friday. A number have shown a positive response to coming to the gospel dinner on Friday. Additionally, about ten students have confirmed to come for the Saturday night student meeting in the saints' homes.

Canada

Nanaimo, BC / Vancouver, BC / Victoria, BC

January 17

We arrived at the Vancouver meeting hall Saturday evening where we had dinner and fellowshipped with the full-timers and entered into the burden of the saints here of praying executing prayers.

January 18

We participated in the combined Lord's table meeting among all the languages (English, Chinese, Korean). Afterwards we went to nearby Burnaby to blend with saints there, visiting the local campus Simon Fraser University (SFU), sharing testimonies and having a love feast together.

January 19

We had a team fellowship with the Vancouver full-timers and then proceeded to table for Bibles for Canada (BFC) at Langara College where we passed out Bibles to the college students. While we were setting up the table, groups of students were coming up to receive the Bibles. For the first shift we only had 60 Bibles and had to get more for the second shift. We were very encouraged by how open the students were - this was the issue of the prayers of the saints!

January 20

We had morning coordination and prayer, then joined the student coordination at the University of British Columbia. After that we had a prayer meeting, and the saints joined us in packing more Bibles.
