NORTH AMERICA

Midwest

Madison, WI / Minneapolis, MN

January 17-19

The team arrived in Madison, Wisconsin on the night of January 17 and since then have been spending a lot of time with the local saints as well as the students at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. The University of Wisconsin-Madison starts their spring semester on Tuesday, January 20. Starting Tuesday, tabling and flying will begin as well as the winter welcome events for the Christians on Campus club.

It has been sweet and encouraging to spend time with the families and students. There are many open students who are hungry/seeking, attending club events, and considering attending the full-time training after graduating.

Mid-Atlantic

Virginia / Washington, D.C.

January 17–18

Our team arrived in Dunn Loring, Virginia, for an orientation meeting and dinner with the saints. We heard the history of the local churches in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan region (the DMV) and learned how the serving ones have been laboring over the past few years.

The following day, we blended with the church in Fairfax, Virginia, for the table meeting. In the evening, we had dinner with the young people from five localities and shared our testimonies and experiences in FTTA. This time allowed us to introduce the training, stir interest in attending, and answer questions. Many parents were touched and followed up with us afterward, sharing their own experiences with the training and asking further questions.

January 19

We gathered in the morning for coordination before splitting into teams of two to three to door-knock in the community near the church in Dunn Loring. Afterward, we debriefed on ways to lengthen our conversations and reflected on the limited openness among the unbelievers.

In the evening, we had dinner with the college students at a saint's home and shared our testimonies and experiences again. We hope that our fellowship stirred greater interest and openness to the training, especially as five students plan to short-term in March.

Colorado

January 17

Five trainees arrived safely in Denver, Colorado. After spending time in hospitality, we attended the young people's meeting at a saint's home.

January 18

Northeast

New Jersey / New York

January 18

We went to the Lord's table meeting in Queens, New York City at Hall 1. There were around 202 adults, 11 children, and 86 over Zoom. There are four languages: Chinese, Korean, Spanish and English. Some of the sister trainees joined the Spanish speaking prophesying meeting and met a new one, D. We went for lunch with some local young working saints at a pizza place.

In the evening, we had dinner and spent time with young people and working saints at a family's home and got to know them.

January 19

We had breakfast at Hall 1 in Queens, and had a joint New York City and New Jersey fellowship time. We learned about the history of the church in New York City and about the current burden of the church.

Prayer burdens:

1. For the going on and blending of the young working saints and young families in New York City.
2. That D would continue to be open to the saints and would join another meeting this week.



Northwest

Bellevue, WA / Bothell, WA / Seattle, WA

January 17

Our team arrived in Bellevue and settled down in our respective hospitality homes before joining the Bellevue young people's meeting. The meeting was to prepare the young people for the upcoming young people's gospel meeting the following week. As such they were practicing with us on inviting their friends to the meeting and/or leading them to salvation. It was encouraging to see that the young people were all burdened for their friends to come and see what the mystery of their human life is.

January 18

We joined the Bellevue Lord's table meeting and a love feast was held afterwards. There was some fellowship given on the history of the church in Bellevue before the mic was passed to the trainees to give a brief testimony and word about the Full-Time Training. In the evening, we were invited to a saint's house for dinner and a brief orientation of our time in Bellevue. We also got the opportunity to get to know some of those who are burdened for Bellevue College, as well as some students from University of Washington from both the Bothell and Seattle campuses.

January 19

After our corporate enjoyment in the morning, a brother gave us a brief history on the migration to the Seattle area and expressed a burden that the Lord would strengthen His testimony eastward to the cities of Redmond, Issaquah, and Sammamish. Furthermore, a brother briefed us with more details regarding the campus work in Bellevue College. Due to its nature as commuter school, much of the contact has been with international students dorming at the campus. Many of these students are from the French-speaking Democratic Republic of the Congo, as well as saints' children who are taking courses there while in high school.

As for what we will be doing in the coming days, we will be tabling to meet contacts and invite them to a gospel seminar on January 21 focusing on a tract titled 'The Big Question.' On a side note, there will be a club fair happening on January 21, where our club will be in attendance.

Prayer burdens:

1. That the Lord would bless the young people with many open friends to come to the gospel meeting.
2. For the seed of the gospel to go out to seeking students, in particular the locals, during the tabling time.
3. That many would be released to come to the gospel seminar on Wednesday, January 21.
4. That the testimonies in Redmond, Issaquah, and Sammamish would be strengthened to become a lampstand.
