EUROPE

France (Paris)

February 2

The seminar on Saturday was full of local saints and eleven new ones! The topic was on “The Bible and its Functions”. Many testified that it was very informative, helpful, and dense. Someone also said, “Now I know where God lives!” Many were enlightened and encouraged by this time to start reading the Bible.

Germany (Berlin)

January 30

Our day began with a morning coordination with the full-time team. One of the brothers joined a morning appointment with a student and later had a lunch appointment with another student. Both times were rich in fellowship and mutual building. In the afternoon, the sisters split into two groups for appointments. Both groups visited families, sharing testimonies and fellowshiping concerning the Lord's work in Berlin. In all our appointments we were simply reminded that we are here to sow seeds wherever we go and to all those we meet, trusting the Lord for the growth.

In the evening, we attended a gospel meeting on the topic “Back in the Father's House,” during which many in that meeting prayed to receive the Lord. At the same time, a pair of sisters joined a small group meeting with many children, where the hosting family shared their testimony and the history of the church in Berlin.

January 31

In the morning and early afternoon, the brothers spent time with their host family, while the sisters spent time with the ones in the sisters' house. Later, we gathered with the young people in Berlin at the meeting hall for a combined young people's time, where they would also stay overnight. We joined them for activities and dinner. After dinner, we participated in a fireside chat with young people from across Europe, during which leading brothers answered questions submitted by young people. The questions that evening focused on the significance of the Lord's table and the importance of having companions.

February 1

In the morning, we attended the Lord's table meeting with the church in Berlin, followed by the young people's meeting. We shared our testimonies and experiences from our time as young people. Many were curious about the training and asked thoughtful questions. One of the young people even asked us to pray for the young people in Berlin to be able to attend the full-time training. Afterward, we enjoyed a love feast and had sweet blending with the saints.

In the evening, we split into two groups for dinner with families. At the sisters' dinner, we heard the saints' testimonies and fellowshiped about the history of the church in Berlin and the Lord's move in Europe. At the brothers' dinner, they enjoyed a warm fellowship with a family.

Prayer Burdens:

1. That the young people of Berlin would be able to go to the full-time training.
2. That the ones that prayed to receive the Lord would be further connected with the local saints and even join a small group/find community in the church.
3. That the Lord would continue to cause the growth in all the seeds sown on this gospel trip.

Ireland

January 31

The trainees went to Belfast, Northern Ireland with some local saints; we were 16 in total. After some exploring of the city, we gathered for dinner and enjoyment with the saints there.

February 1

As there is no lampstand in Belfast yet, the trainees began the day by blending with hospitality. In the afternoon, the 15 saints and six young people in Belfast gathered to hear the trainees' testimonies and to have a time of overflowing. In the evening after driving back to Dublin, we joined a Zoom call with some saints that had migrated to Dublin and then moved back to the US.

February 2

On our last day in Ireland, we went back to Trinity College to hand out tracts and see some college students one last time. For dinner we joined local saints and went over highlights and enjoyments from our trip.

Prayer Burdens:

1. That the Lord would establish a lampstand in Belfast in 2026.
2. That there would be a reaping of the seeds sown, especially with Irish students.
3. For the increase in Christ of all the saints in Ireland, including the new ones, for the preparation for the Bride and the Lord's return.

Italy (Milan)

January 31

We began the day with an orientation with all the Italy sub-teams in the Milan meeting hall. It was wonderful to see all the saints both local and from around the world gathered together for the Lord's move!

In the afternoon, we went to two different shopping malls to begin our gospel preaching. Since it was a Saturday, many local saints joined us. The tract we mainly passed out was called “Hai Mangiato Bene?” (“Have you eaten well?”) presenting the Lord as food for the hunger in our being. There were a good number of Italians open to having a conversation with us. One of them couldn't speak English well but still endeavored to talk to us through Google translate. We gave him a *Basic Elements of the Christian Life* and he asked for another one for his cousin. We also met a catholic man who had been reading the Bible for many years. He listened very intently to our sharing about the Lord Jesus as the bread of life for us to eat, and he responded saying, “That is very interesting and got me thinking.” We ended up giving him our number so he could reach out to us when he is ready. In the evening, we had dinner and a blending time between the local and visiting saints.

February 1

In the morning, we had the Lord's table meeting (in Italian, Chinese, and English) at the meeting hall in Milan. Afterwards, we headed to Lecco, where the Olympics torch relay was happening, to pass out tracts. There were a number of open ones willing to hear about the Lord and followed us to pray. Towards the end, a local student approached the table with a curious question about the sinful nature of man. From this, we led her to understand the human fallen condition and helped her to receive the Lord by calling on Him. We then were able to have more fellowship with her in a nearby restaurant, while waiting for the torch relay.

We later exchanged contact information and hope to read *Basic Elements of the Christian Life* with her later this week. We also met two Italian students who were really open and they offered to show us around the city later this week. We pray this would happen so that through this opportunity something of the Lord can be revealed to them.

January 27-28

Local saints came with us as we spent time on the gospel at Purdue University with a focus on more intimate conversations to find ones that could be added for the strengthening of the locality. All trainees joined the prayer meeting at a saints’ home.

We went on appointments with new contacts and college students. Later Wednesday night, we attended a Purdue Bible study with college students and new contacts.

January 29-30
