Report and Prayer Burdens 20

February 3, 2026

EUROPE

Italy (Padua)

January 31 – February 1

On Saturday, January 31, after coordinating together in Milan, our sub-team traveled to Padua where we met the one family who lives in Padua for the spread of the Lord's testimony there. We enjoyed the Lord together and heard a little about how the Lord brought them to Italy and to Padua, and how the previous gospel trip in Padua was. The Lord is really using the children of this family as gospel seeds on the university campus to reach many students at the University of Padua. The trip is expected to focus on following up with some of these contacts to establish them more. The next day we joined the Lord's table meeting in Vicenza and had a love feast with the saints there.



February 2

Today we set up a table in the city center near the university to distribute materials and preach the gospel. While singing at the table we noticed many of the locals turning to listen to our singing, and some even approached the table themselves. We sensed that the singing was a great help to the atmosphere and was attractive to the local people. A man even came to the table and sang with us, saying he loves Jesus.

Overall we found that a good number of people were open to having conversations and a few gave their contact info for further contact. E, an Ethiopian believer who is a student at the University of Padua, wants to have further contact with us. A and K, a mom and daughter who have been practicing Catholicism for the past few years, would like to join some of our meetings. The daughter received a Spanish New Testament with footnotes. They've set up an appointment with some saints on the team for tomorrow morning after they attend mass. We also met a high school student, M, from France who attends a Catholic school there. She reads the Bible at home once a week and in school, but when asked if she knows Jesus she said she wasn't sure. We told her about her spirit and how she can easily know Jesus by praying. She received a tract and a French New Testament with footnotes.

The brothers also had an appointment with a contact, AL, from the previous gospel trip who is a student at the University of Padua. He grew up Catholic but has been seeking something deeper. He has been reading the *Basic Elements of the Christian Life* on his own after receiving it last week. In the appointment we covered how to contact the Lord moment by moment by calling on Him to enjoy a daily salvation.

In the previous gospel trip, the saints met someone visiting the University of Padua to speak to a non-denominational Christian Bible study group. He was familiar with the writings of Watchman Nee and invited the saints to attend the Bible study to speak to the students there. We plan to send some this week to open the riches of the ministry and footnotes to them.

Italy (Rome)

February 2

We started our day fellowshipping in the meeting hall of Rome. We were encouraged to see so many young families migrate to Rome for His testimony. It was sweet to see such a dynamic church life in Rome. The gospel preaching right now is focusing on the campus work, and the saints desire to have core students on campus.

During noon time we tabled on the street close to the Sapienza University of Rome, one of the top 3 schools in Italy with 120,000 students. The students are currently having final exams, so it is hard to stop the students

when they are on their way to finals and to have conversations with them. But the saints exercised their spirit, endeavoring for every chance to talk to the students. When there is an opportunity, we open the tract ("Hai mangiato bene" — have you eaten well) and introduce the tract to them in a concise way. In this way, many are able to stop to listen to us, and even willing to exchange contact info with us.

Even though it is an Italian university, there are a lot of international students who are able to speak in English. The students here also told us some of the classes were taught in English, thus language difference was not a barrier to us. Some students come to the table out of curiosity, and become really open after hearing the gospel. Several students with religious backgrounds are open to have appointments with the saints. A lot of saints were able to preach the gospel to the students when having lunch at the cafeteria.

February 3

We were tabling near the Sapienza University of Rome again today. The saints were singing hymns in Italian and English. Despite the weather being a bit gloomy and the traffic on the pedestrian way was not as much as yesterday, the ones we were talking to are more open than yesterday. We were able to exchange more personal contact with the new ones. Some brothers even had a chance to have an appointment with a new one right after meeting him on the street.

Some sisters went to an appointment with a student we met yesterday this morning, who has a Christian background. At lunch time, the student met with the sisters again with her friend. She told us that she calls upon the Lord every day. The sisters are currently reading some ministry materials with her.

At night, we had dinner at one of the saint's homes and enjoyed sweet fellowship. After that we went to the prayer meeting at the meeting hall together.

We went to a nearby city called Cordoba to visit the saints and distribute the Bible in the city center. The church in Spain actually started in the southern part of Spain, Cordoba being one of them, and two families have faithfully remained there. They recently got a bigger meeting hall and the brothers believe that the Lord will fill in the gap. We tabled and passed out tracts and Bibles. There was one touching conversation. We went up to a student who was sitting alone on the bench. At the beginning he was not open and said he is an atheist. But we kept talking to him regarding “The Mystery of Human Life” tract and read the verses from the Bible. He eventually prayed with us and asked us for contact information. This was so encouraging. May the Lord keep working on this young man and keep him connected with the saints in Cordoba.

February 1

In Malaga, we were able to spend time with our hospitality and then went to the Lord’s table meeting in the evening.

NORTH AMERICA

Canada

Nanaimo, BC / Vancouver, BC / Victoria, BC

January 27 – February 1

On Tuesday, January 27, we returned to Vancouver Island University (VIU) for another day of tabling and distributed 61 Bibles, bringing our two-day total at VIU to 116 Bibles, with 38% of students requesting further contact. On Wednesday, we traveled to Victoria and handed out eight Bibles at various stops throughout the city. Then we visited 14 homes, including both local saints and new ones, to fellowship and encourage them in the Lord. Saturday night there was a precious young people’s gathering where the trainees shared their testimonies, conveying the burden of the full-time training and how the Lord has been working in each one of us. Lastly, we gathered for the Lord’s table with 42 adults—30 local saints and 12 visitors—and enjoyed such a sweet fellowship and blending together in His presence.

Prayer burdens:

1. For dormant saints to be recovered and stirred up to love the Lord afresh.
2. To raise up His testimony in Nanaimo and Victoria, that the saints would rise up and coordinate in one accord for a strong and shining testimony in these cities.
3. For the saints to daily enter into the Word through *The Holy Word for Morning Revival*, continually seeing His preciousness and being nourished by Him.



Midwest

Madison, WI / Minneapolis, MN

January 29

We began the morning with personal time, coordination, prayer, and much fellowship. In the afternoon, we preached the gospel and had a Christians on Campus club table, giving us the opportunity to talk and to meet students. The Lord then arranged some divine appointments before we had dinner with some local saints in their homes.

January 30-31

We began Friday morning with personal time, coordination, prayer, and fellowship, with many local saints joining us.
